

CAMP RULES

Your safety is paramount throughout your camp experience. We are your guardians during your visit to Clemson so we expect your total concentration and respect to abide by all rules regulations and requirements designated by the Camp staff or members of the Clemson University community.

In order for you to enjoy the full benefit of all the camp activities in and out of the pool, you will be expected to abide by the following camp rules in order to insure your safety:

1. The male residence is Holmes, and the female residence is McCabe. Other than during planned camp activities in the residence social areas, campers are restricted to their own residence hall.
2. "Lights out" is at 10:00 pm each night and everyone should be up in the morning to head to breakfast at 7.30.
3. Everyone is required to attend breakfast.
4. Proper attire must be worn in the cafeteria, in the hallways of the residences, while moving through campus at all times. Some form of shoes must be worn, men are not to go shirtless, and women must wear a tank over running tops to move around campus.
5. For safety, we must limit camper movements around our campus. To leave campus, or to attend any activity not planned for the camp group, or for any other purpose, campers must first consult with a staff member. Someone from the camp staff must know where campers are at all times. (In most cases, we require that a staff member be with campers at all times).
6. Every camper is expected to be on campus throughout the entire week. Campers are not permitted to leave camp – unless for an emergency, or pre-arranged appointment only. In these rare cases, camper must be signed out by parent / responsible adult who will agree to return camper to camp at arranged time. (Parents should recognize that arbitrarily removing children from camp disturbs camp dynamics and the ability of their child to better integrate with the group).
7. Campers should stay with their assigned group. Campers should **never** be alone on campus during camp.
8. If the camper brings a car to camp, they are asked to hand over the keys to the Camp Director upon enrollment. Under no circumstances may the camper use a second set of keys or any other method to operate the car during the week of camp. The camp director must approve any driving away from campus and community area. There is no need for driving while attending camp.
9. Campers are expected to be present and on time for all activities.

10. Profanity, smoking, drinking, drugs, fighting, etc. are not permitted at camp, and will result in suspension without refund of fees.
11. Rooms should be kept neat and orderly. All residence hall rules should be adhered to.
12. While fun and play is integral to the camp experience, campers must understand that there will be no horseplay where injury to self or others, or damage to property could result. All facility rules must be followed.
13. The pool should never be entered without proper supervision.
14. Diving into the water head first without first checking the depths or getting permission from a staff member is not permitted.
15. Campers breaking camp rules will be sent home. Parents/guardians of the campers will be held accountable for any property damage. Camp fees will not be refunded. Any camper sent home for disciplinary reasons will not be permitted to return.

After registration, on the first day of camp, an in-depth orientation will introduce all campers to the Camp Staff and will assist all in becoming familiar with the camp organization. At this first orientation, camp rules will be presented again as a reminder of responsibilities while at camp.

Before reporting to camp, parents/guardians are encouraged to read and understand the rules of the Camp, and discuss with the camper. It is important to understand that Camp rules are intended for the protection of everyone.

Camp Rules may be amended at any time, and campers will be informed of any changes.
